BOAT LANDING MONITORS

Many of you may have noticed or encountered individuals with clipboards at our D landing over the last couple of years. Beginning in 2010, we used a group of volunteers from around the lake who were trained by the DNR on the process of how to inspect boats/trailers for signs of potential AIS threats. They use a checklist that they follow and ask a series of questions to each group that launches their boat. The purpose of this process is not only to safeguard our lake, but to also serve as an education process on AIS. All the information is then logged and loaded into a database platform which chronicles the information by lake.

In mid summer of 2010, we made an arrangement with the Sigurd Olson Environmental Institute of which we "employ" students to take on this role. Our current grant gives us funding from the state to cover 300 hours each year. This proved to be a wonderful opportunity for these students who in many cases are planning to work in some environmental field in the future. Because of the success of this program, we continued it in 2011 and covered the D landing from the opening weekend of fishing until Labor Day, with the focus being on weekend coverage. For 2011, we were able to educate/inspect 845 total boats and met the 300 hour requirement for the grant.

For 2012, we would like to expand this program to possibly include additional landings and have sought out additional funds from our townships and potentially in the form of a grant from the state. Our hope is to reach as many people as possible in an effort to ensure our lake is protected.

TELEMARK POINTE LETTER

Dear Mr. Spangberg,

Please be advised that the Namakagon Lake Association's Board of Directors is diametrically opposed to Telemark Pointe's permit request for what can only be deemed a "marina" on Telemark Pointe's property on the Namakagon Chain of Lakes. The particular area of Garden Lake that Telemark Pointe is directly adjacent to has been designated a Sensitive Area based on your department's Lake Sensitive Area Survey (Site 31. Garden Lake 2 GL/2). Consequently your own department has determined that "shoreland management that is more protective than the minimum standards is encouraged."

In addition, NLA is deeply concerned that the added congestion of a marina will have a substantial negative impact on property values on both Garden Lake and the rest of the Namakagon Chain of Lakes. We also have concerns that such a development would constitute "key holing" and as such is illegal. There is also the fact that a marina such as this would be in violation of our Township's Comprehensive Plan. The Town of Namakagon's position is that the DNR only permit two dock slips per completed building with no more than 20 total slips at the completion of the project. This project must comply with the Town of Namakagon Comprehensive Plan. And beyond that, the increased traffic and congestion would degrade what remains of Namakagon's pristine near wilderness environment which is cherished by each and every one of our members and Directors.

UPDATE ON HEALTH OF THE LAKE

Steven Spickerman, Plant Ecologist with the US Forest Service notified the NLA of the results of a 3 day lake survey. No aquatic invasive species were identified. They plan to survey the lake every 5 years. The Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission also surveyed for other invasive (non-plant) and did not find any concerns.

THANK YOU TO ALL MY "LOONY" FRIENDS ON LAKE NAMAKAGON

The "Loon monitoring team" that I envisioned in May of 2011 turned out to be a very large loose group of everyone I talked to during the summer and early autumn of 2011. Thank you to everyone who helped watch the Loons. I think we all learned so much about the Loons on our lake. Sometimes our Loons did the expected and sometimes they did not.

On Lake Namakagon we had five pairs of Loons who built nests and attempted to hatch chicks soon after ice out. All of these attempts failed and each pair built a second nest close to the first one and laid eggs again. Only two of those second nesting attempts produced one chick each.

During the July 4th week end a pair of Loons was spotted with a very young chick in the area of Sugar Bay that had been used in previous years as a "nursery". On the morning of July 12 a tiny chick was spotted in Funny's Bay carefully hidden by two adult Loons. Watching these chicks grow and being concerned for their welfare was a wonderful experience. Many thanks to everyone who shared their experiences observing the Loons throughout the summer.

I want to thank Bunk Kofal and his guests for touring the whole lake around August 15 and recording on a map how many Loons and chicks they saw. They reported 45 adult Loons and two chicks.

I also want to tell you all, that these Loon parents fear a fast moving jet ski most of all. We watched the sheer panic of our Loon family as they heard a speeding jet ski enter the bay. Loon chicks are completely helpless because they cannot dive to get out of the way.

The majority of the Loons who lived on Lake Namakagon or visited it were gone by October 3rd. One parent remained with each chick until later in the month. Also, two other young Loons came to our lake in early October. I last saw "Funny Baby" on November 17th. The next morning ice was starting to form and Funny's Bay was covered with ice by November 19th.

My hope is that you will enjoy watching the Loons that you see on Lake Namakagon in 2012. I would love to hear from you about anything you observe. If you see a Loon chick or find what seems like a nesting area please let us know.

I did fill out the Loon Watch Annual Lake Monitoring Form and submit it on November 1. I intend to do this again in 2012. HAPPY LOON WATCHING!

Minutes of April 16, 2011 Meeting

Reviewed by Board and membership in attendance. A motion to approve was made by Steve Riley and seconded by Lisa Holt. The minutes were approved.

Treasures Report:

Submitted by Tim Browne, read by Denise Dupras. The General Accounting balance as of 5/11/2011 was reported as \$28,818.95. Motion to accept report made by Steve Riley and seconded by Lisa Holt. The report was approved

Board Candidates:

The group discussed the need to identify at least 3 candidates to fill the outgoing Board positions. All were encouraged to identify and talk to potential candidates. With the increased involvement with Northland College, the work related to grants should be substantially less. Notice will be placed in the upcoming newsletter.

Fun on the Water Update:

Denise updated the Board on the event. The date has been changed to Saturday July 23. The permit has been purchased. Al Stawicki and Linda Fischer will again coordinate the event.

Shoreland Restoration:

Denise will contact Mike Gardner to see if he will be able to come to the Annual Meeting and give a presentation on this. Bob Parsonage has a list of potential interested land owners which will serve as a starting point. Information about this will be included in the upcoming newsletter.

Lake Clean-Up:

Tom Nelson is coordinating the activity this year. Some of the areas have been canvased others will be done as soon as boats are in.

Update on HWY D Landing Renovation:

Phil Rasmussen updated the group on the timetable for this. Jim Krueger told him that at this time, they do not anticipate doing any work at the landing until after Labor Day. Denise will update Eric Lindberg as the ILIDs will need to be delayed further. Steve Riley also raised the concern that we may need another extension for the WDNR Grant as implementation of the 4th ILID is delayed again.

FOTH Update:

The WDNR has made final payments to the NLA for the grants. All funds have been paid to FOTH based on the prior agreement made between Brian Hinrichs and the NLA (via email with Denise Dupras). The Board considers this relationship and obligations completed.

Facebook Update:


Denise will contact Ruth Lull to determine where we are with regards to the Facebook page.

New Signage at the Landing:

The new sign at Lakewoods will be moved to the Landing site. Lisa Holt will take care of the installation of the sign. Phil Rasmussen will be reimbursed for his contribution towards the sign. Monies from the Town will be used to offset the additional cost.

Bayfield County Lakes Forum Presentation:

Jim Brakken presented information on the pilot project for "Tackle Swap on Lake Namakagon." He brought materials on the project as well as non-toxic tackle. The NLA will participate in this project at selected landings for 3 hours on selected days. The landing monitors will help with this. Mr. Brakken said that the exchange is voluntary at this time and that only limited amounts will be able to be swapped for any given individual. He also talked about the benefits of this for improving the habitat for wildlife. At the landings there will be a short survey to assess the attitudes of the fishermen. He will also work with the Cable Chamber of Commerce to educate the businesses and encourage the use and sale of non-toxic tackle going forward. There will also be tackle swap at NLA events including FOTW and the Annual Meeting.



The second project is a fund raising project with the potential to bring income to the NLA. An independent photographer has taken multiple pictures of the local lakes in northwestern Wisconsin including Namakagon, Garden, Cable, Owen,... in Bayfield County. All available can be seen at www.bayfieldcountylakes.org. For group orders of > 6 photos, the NLA will get a 10% commission, an additional 20% will go to fund the BCLF. An article will be in the newsletter promoting this project.

Membership: Denise updated the Board on the current membership. As of May 20, there are a total of 376 members, but only 175 are paid for 2011. 78 members have not paid since 2009 and will be dropped from the mailing. An email will be sent to all members to remind them that the dues must be postmarked by June 1 to be eligible to vote in August.

Newsletters:

Denise apologized for not having the newsletter out, but will get all the materials to Jamie and have them out soon. The group discussed the costs and recognized that mailing through the chamber would not result in significant savings, but potentially a more complicated process for the NLA. Decision was made to continue the current process.

Next Meeting:

The next meeting will be held on June 25th. Because of a scheduling conflict the May meeting could not be held at Grand View. We will tentatively plan to meet at Grand View at 9 AM.

Correspondence:

Janet Porter recently attended the Loon Ranger training program and would like to coordinate the loon watch activities on the Lake. There was unanimous support for this. Phil Rasmussen appointed her NLA Loon Watch coordinator. An article will be placed in the newsletter encouraging all interested parties to contact Janet directly.

Reviewed by Board and membership in attendance. A motion to approve was made by Julia Campbell and seconded by Linda Fischer. The minutes were approved.

Treasures Report:

Not available at the time of meeting.

Board Candidates:

Lisa Holt has identified one candidate for the Board. Membership was encouraged to consider running for a position.

Fun on the Water Update:

Linda updated the Board on the event. The date has been changed to Saturday July 23. Al Stawicki sent a tentative schedule which Denise shared at the meeting. We are still looking for a few volunteers to help with events. This year we will again work to get sponsors of the event and put their names on the t-shirts to recognize their contribution.

FOTH Update:

The WDNR has made final payments to the NLA for the grants. All funds have been paid to FOTH based on the prior agreement made between Brian Hinrichs and the NLA (via email with Denise Dupras). There was a bill for past due, but it appears this will not be due to FOTH based on prior agreement.

Facebook Update:

Ruth Lull updated the membership on the Facebook page. She is looking for contributors and encouraged everyone to "like" the NLA on Facebook. Also linking to local business was suggested to increase visibility.

New Signage at the Landing:

The new sign at Lakewoods will be moved to the Landing site. Lisa Holt will take care of the installation of the sign. Phil Rasmussen will be reimbursed for his contribution towards the sign. The posts were damaged by the ice this winter, so new posts will need to be installed. Denise will contact Jim Krueger to see if the Town will put in new posts. It was approved that Jim Krueger remove the old AIS signs and install the new ones at all of the landings. The apron at the landing for launching boats has also been repaired.

ILIDS Update:

We have still been unable to get the camera at Landing up and running. Denise will contact Eric to see what other options there are to get it operational. Julia indicated that we are required to monitor all of videos and we will try and get members at large involved in reviewed some of them to meet our requirement.

Landing Monitors:

Due to vacation schedules the students were not available for the Memorial Day weekend. Knowing this next year we will have an alternative plan to ensure adequate monitors. We continue to monitor D and the students will be involved in the "Toxic Tackle Swap" initiative of the BLCF. Julia was thanked for housing the students when they are at the lake.

ELECTION UPDATE

The election was held at the Annual Meeting in August. Outgoing members included Lisa Holt, Phil Rasmussen and Tim Browne. Only 2 members were elected at the meeting, Barb Best and W. Steve Musser. There were a small number of write-in candidates who all declined to serve on the Board. At the November meeting of the NLA, Mr. Greg Dehring was appointed to a one year position to fill the remaining vacancy.

Namakagon Lake Association 2012 Lake Planning Grant Application

SCOPE OF WORK

All work includes:

Namakagon Lake, Jackson Lake and Garden Lake

- Define the drainage area of the Namakagon chain of lakes
 - Determine land ownership
 - Identify major land uses
- Investigate the areas of the watershed that may be supplying excessive amounts of sediment and nutrients.
 - Shoreline assessment
 - Sanitary survey (bacteriological sampling)
- Inventory sensitive area sites identified in the Namakagon Lake Sensitive Area Survey conducted by WDNR in 2000.
- Gather and analyze water quality data
- Determine the trophic state of the lake
- Clarify the existing classification of all surface waters within the system under NR 102
- Investigate the aquatic plant community and analyze the management alternatives
 - Point-intercept survey
 - Native and exotic plant community mapping
- Prepare a summary of recent historic fisheries data, biological information relating to specific fish species, and how it applies to the management plan.
- Develop and implement a stakeholder participation and public information strategy
 - Public meetings
 - Planning meetings
 - Outreach education
- Develop a final report that includes methodologies / results of all tasks and details management, protection, enhancement alternatives and recommendations.


