Message from the President...

The lake cleanup group has been out and as I said there was allot of debris. I want to thank all that participated in this project; it seemed like an extra tough job this year. All of these projects relate back to our commitment to keep our lake clean and free from invasive species and VHS. Keeping this lake clean is a tough job and we need all of our members to help mainly by passing the word to friends and visitors to check trailers for weeds before launching, making sure live wells, bilges, and ballast tanks are dry before launching, and not to dump bait buckets into the lake. Please inform people that these issues are all laws that are being enforced by the DNR this year.

This year again we need volunteers to spend a few hours at the boat landings informing people that are launching boats about the laws and observing the boat being launched for any weeds etc. As I said in past letters it is better to be proactive instead of reactive on these issues. Please try to spare 4 hours

VHS PREVENTION

We want people to continue to enjoy Wisconsin's great fishing and boating, but need everyone to do their part.



The following statewide rules apply to boaters, anglers and wild bait harvesters in Wisconsin and went into effect April 4, 2008.

BOATERS AND ANGLERS

The following new laws apply to all anglers and boaters in Wisconsin:

- You must drain all water from boats, containers and fishing equipment when leaving any state waters, banks or shores, or entering Wisconsin over land. This does not apply to any drinking water or up to 2 gallons of water being used to hold minnows that can be legally transported.
- You may not transport any live fish or live fish eggs away from any state waters. There is an exception for minnows obtained from a Wisconsin bait dealer. These minnows may be transported away live and used again:
 - ✗ On the same water, or
 - ✗ On any other waters if no lake or river water, or other fish were added to their container.
- You may not use dead fish, fish eggs, or fish parts as bait. There are three exceptions:
 - ✗ You may use dead fish, fish eggs, or fish parts as bait on any waters if they were preserved by a method that does not require freezing or refrigeration, or
 - ✗ You may use unpreserved or just frozen dead fish, fish eggs or fish parts as bait on the water from which they were collected or on Lake Michigan or Green Bay (and connecting waters upstream to the first barrier impassible to fish), or
 - ✗ Live minnows that die during a fishing trip may be used during that fishing trip (they may not be used on later trips unless you meet the two conditions above).
- You may not possess or use minnows for bait that are obtained outside of Wisconsin. This does not apply if the minnows were imported under a Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) permit, or if they were obtained from Iowa or Minnesota and are being used only "between the tracks" on the Mississippi River

CHECK YOUR ENVELOPE ADDRESS LABEL

If the number following your name (in parentheses) is (2007) or a lower number, for example (2004), your Annual Membership Fee/Newsletter Renewal is due now. If the number following your name is (2008) or higher, you are paid up. Keep in touch and keep the Newsletters coming for the next calendar year. If you have not been getting the Newsletter three times a year, you can start right now by sending in your membership dues. (It is not necessary to pay for unpaid years to reinstate the Newsletter)

GRANT UPDATE

The Namakagon Lake Association was recently notified that all three of our grant applications have been approved & funded by WDNR. The grant applications were drafted by NLA's environmental engineering firm, Liesch Environmental of Madison Wisconsin www.liesch.com and NLA Directors Tom Nelson & Steve Riley. The three grants consist of the Lake Namakagon Baseline Aquatic Plant Survey, the Lake Namakagon Aquatic Plant Management Plan & Sanitary Survey and the Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Control Grant. Included in these grants are funds to complete a sanitary survey by water sample of Lake Namakagon, boat landing survey along with funding for AIS monitors at our landings, printing of educational materials & newsletters, plant survey, aquatic plant management plan and eventually a Comprehensive Lake Management Plan for Lake Namakagon, Garden Lake & Jackson Lake. Public hearings will be required by WDNR as a condition of funding our grants. We anticipate scheduling at least two public hearings this summer in the Towns of Namakagon and Grand View in conjunction with the Town Supervisors and Chairmen of those respective Townships. Both Townships are participating in the planning and in kind funding of our three grants.

Our objective in participating in these time consuming projects is to position Lake Namakagon for expedited State funding to combat and control AIS in our Lake in the event it ever becomes necessary. Additionally, the Townships, WDNR and the NLA Board feel it is in the best interests of our lake community to have an approved plan to deal with both AIS and future lake management issues. What follows is exactly how we intend to go about achieving these objectives:

Data Completion and Review/Project Coordination:

- Liesch will review the information provided by NLA and Bayfield County related to the lake, which may include topographic and depth maps, water quality data, previous plant survey data, previous sanitary survey information, demographic and property information (land use & zoning), etc. Liesch will also collect information from WDNR related to previous lake surveys & testing, all of which will be used to compile the sanitary survey report and the Baseline Aquatic Plant Survey Report.
- The sanitary survey will consist of visual assessment of shoreline for evidence of septic system failure and water samples. This will be accomplished during lake plant sampling (July 14-18, July 28-August 1 and August 18-22). The boats used to accomplish this are being furnished compliments of Phil Rasmussen of Lakewood's Resort.
- The boat ramp survey will consist of plant sampling at each ramp while the aquatic plant survey will consist of plant collection and assessment at GPS locations defined by WDNR as outlined in the grants. At each GPS location a depth reading will be recorded along with sampling of plant species. The Lake Survey will be completed during the aforementioned three week period. Liesch will provide the staff to collect samples, record depth readings and plant populations.

Upon completion of the sampling & septic survey, Liesch will develop a sanitary survey report and Baseline Aquatic Plant survey

Report/Management Plan. These reports will include the information specified by WDNR in the three grant applications. Approximate payments to Liesch as specified by the contract executed by Liesch and NLA VP Steve Riley on May 10, 2008 are as follows: Sanitary Survey \$4,000, Aquatic Management Plan \$4,957.50, Baseline Plant Survey \$8,300, Boat Landing survey \$3,750 and Supplemental plant Archive \$3,200 for a total of \$24,207.50. Matching grant funds appropriated by the Townships total \$6,000 with WDNR grants covering the projected balance due Liesch.

NAMAKAGON LAKE ASSOCIATION MEETING MINUTES

(May 10, 2008)

The meeting was called to order at 9:10 AM by President Jim Krueger

Board Members Present: Krueger, Riley, Porter, Yerhot, Dupras, Nelson

Board Member Absent: Rasmuessen

NLA Member Attendees: 4

Minutes of April 5, 2008 read, moved and seconded by Riley & Nelson

Treasurers Report read, moved and seconded by Riley & Porter. Balance as of April 30, 2008 was \$19,713.23.

Guest Speaker was Eric Lindberg – Environmental Sentry Protection, LLC. Last year the NLA purchased surveillance cameras, for two boat launch ramps, to monitor boats and trailers for the presence of weeds. Mr. Lindberg spoke on the 2007 history of the camera usage, camera updates for better visual control, audio enhancement options & repositioning cameras for best picture clarity. A motion was made by Rick Yerhot and unanimously passed for adding audio enhancement to the camera sites.

Lake Clean-up: Tom Nelson shared that he has contacted persons named for cleaning the different zones of the lake. Hopefully the weather will be such that this project will be completed by May end or shortly thereafter.

Grant Update: Steve Riley updated the Board as to the acceptance of and requirements for three grants issued by the WDNR to the NLA.

An announcement of Public Input Forum will be posted to provide public input to the Comprehensive Lake Management Plan grant.

W.A.L. Conference: Date is June 20 at Telemark Resort & Convention Center from 7:30 AM until 5:00 PM. Registration fee is \$45.00. Bayfield County Lakes Forum is offering an incentive for "new" attendees to the conference. Three "new" attendees go for the price of one. Also, for all NLA members, NLA will pay \$20 towards the registration fee of any NLA member.

Buoy Placement: Jim Krueger & Bill Porter of NLA and Namakagon Maintenance Personnel Dave Vaillancourt and Rick Messal placed 7 "No Wake" and 10 "Rock" buoys & 2 "channel markers" into the lake on May 6th. Ice out was "unofficially" May 3rd.

Clean Boat/Clean Water: Board Member responsibility was

taken. A largely volunteer program, it was discussed who from the Board would shoulder responsibility of the program. Jim Krueger volunteered to oversee and Denise Dupras volunteered to do the computer inputting. Clyde Wishart, an NLA member, heads up our volunteer commitment.

Maps: Denise Dupras is revamping our Personalized "Namakagon Lake Association" map brochure. A map of the lake including "Rock" and "No Wake" buoys, service commercial establishments, and NLA Mission Statement and Courtesy/Etiquette codes will be included. This brochure will be distributed by the boat launch volunteers and commercial establishments and available to anyone who wishes.

Board Nominees: Upcoming election for Board Members will be at the Annual Meeting, August 16th. The Board encouraged members to become involved on the Board. Those interested should send bio to board@nlaonline.org or to NLA; Box 536; Cable, WI 54821 or contact a Board Member.

BOAT LAUNCH SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS

Mr. Eric Lindberg, from Environmental Sentry Protection, attended the May meeting of the NLA Board. At the meeting, he reviewed the challenges we faced on Lake Namekagon during the past year and the findings from our cameras at Funny's Bay and Garden Lake. He also discussed his experiences with the camera configurations at other lakes where the cameras are set up to monitor the launch sites. He discussed what is being done in Burnett County to protect the lakes and a brochure they are developing with a picture of Babe Winkelman on the front educating boaters about the rules and regulations and ways to keep our waters clean.

At a previous meeting Denise Dupras presented the data about the captures after reviewing all of the information. Both she and Mr. Lindberg indicated that no weeds were seen on any trailer or boat that was launched at monitored sites. Mr. Lindberg indicated that this was in contrast to other sites where the cameras are installed in Minnesota.

A discussion of the issues surrounding the configuration of the cameras included board members and attendees. While the settings can be optimized for resolution, time of recording and triggering, the camera memory cannot be upgraded which limits the changes that can be made. We discussed as a group realigning the cameras to optimally capture both the trailer and the boat license in order to be able to identify offenders and potentially issue citations.

Mr. Lindberg also indicated that other options such as infrared or incandescent lighting at launches to improve visibility at dusk should become available later in the year, with an estimated cost of \$200. Additional upgrades that the Board authorized include a warning audio message that can be played when a camera is triggered. The message will play with a delay of 30 to 45 seconds and repeat 3 times. There was recognition that we will need to ensure that the noise does not bother the individuals who live in the area of the launches and will start initially at Funny's Bay.

Mr. Lindberg expressed a desire to work closely with us to optimize the performance of the cameras on our lake. Denise Dupras has volunteered to work with him this year in the monitoring of the cameras and launches.

LAKESIDE FIREWORKS

Fireworks are pretty for an instant. The lakes can be beautiful forever, if we all do our part.

The use of fireworks is often discussed at lake association meetings. Folks are concerned about the fireworks litter that can be found all around some lakes following the weekend of the fourth. Others question the 'stretching' of the celebration from one night to several weeks. Comments are also heard about the safety, legality, noise pollution and forest fire hazard issues that are all part of fireworks.

In Wisconsin, it is legal for a licensed dealer to sell fireworks. **It is not legal to transport or possess them or to use fireworks without a permit.** Permits sold at fireworks outlets are usually not valid. Without that permit, fireworks, other than the garden variety available at grocery stores, are illegal in Wisconsin. Any rocket, large or small, and items that take flight or explode are unlawful and the bearer is subject to citation. Littering is also illegal, compounding the violation and fines. We need to share this information with visitors and friends.

With this advice in mind, folks should also bear in mind both the liability and safety risks before using any illegal fireworks. If you do choose to hold your own display however, consider these tips:

- Call the County Sheriff to request a permit.
- Try to end your display before 11 o'clock, out of respect to others on your lake.
- Use fireworks only on or near July 4th.
- Keep safety first in mind.
- Remember, fires travel quickly in the woods.
- Fireworks aren't toys and they are not for kids.
- The next morning, send someone out in a boat to clean up the mess. Dispose of the litter properly.

Many of our local communities have wonderful fireworks displays. Consider taking one in, both to save your money from going up in smoke and for the sake of the lake. Fireworks are pretty for an instant. The lakes can be beautiful forever, if we all do our part. Be safe and enjoy the holiday!

AMENDATORY ORDINANCE EXCERPT

Sec. 16-2-3 Prohibited Transport of Aquatic Plants and Animals.

No person may transport any boat, boat trailer, personal watercraft and its associated trailer, canoe, kayak, or boating equipment from navigable waters onto a public highway if aquatic plants or animals are attached, or to do so in violation of an order from a law enforcement officer who has reason to believe that aquatic plants or animals are attached, except as provided in Section 16-2-4.
